Community Speed Watch Policy Statement

1. Policy statement

Cleveland Police is committed to reducing the number of people killed and injured as a result of road traffic collisions. It is widely recognised that vehicle speed is often a contributory factor in road traffic collisions and is also associated with anti-social behaviour in some communities.

In recognition that the perception of speed can affect the quality of life for residents Cleveland Police aims to work with the local communities to deliver Community Speed Watch schemes.

The Community Speed Watch scheme allows local communities to work with the police in addressing these issues and provides those who participate with a sense of ownership and satisfaction in their involvement with the perceived problem and the potential solutions.
