# Location Inspection and Hazard Notification Policy Statement

## 1. Policy statement

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### Location Inspection

In order to satisfy legal, moral and financial requirements, Cleveland Police will, in conjunction with the Estates Business Partner (Steria), regularly inspect and monitor health and safety standards and management systems within **all** locations occupied by police personnel.

A comprehensive system of inspecting all locations on a cyclical basis will contribute to the early detection and subsequent correction of conditions which may, if left unattended, ultimately lead to near miss incidents, accidents and/or litigation both civil and criminal.

The Health and Safety Policy of Cleveland Police delegates' day-to-day health and safety management functions to Service Unit Managers. Who can discharge elements of that function via a corporate self- inspection regime.

### Hazard Notification Form

All Cleveland Police personnel have a statutory duty to take care of themselves and others and to likewise co-operate with their employer in discharging any relevant statutory provisions imposed upon them.

To empower staff to co-operate fully, a corporate hazard notification form, is available, which must be completed when any building related hazard or condition is identified.
