Major Incident Enquiry Officer's Work Book Policy Statement

1. Policy statement

The Criminal Procedure and Investigation Act details the responsibility of Police Officers in relation to the disclosure of materials obtained during criminal investigations.

Disclosure, and the preparation required to deliver it, can be a major administrative task especially during and after major or large scale enquiries.

As Investigators, the Police have a responsibility to:-

- Retain relevant material;
- Record relevant material;
- Ensure that such material is released to the Prosecutor.

Therefore, the Major Incident Enquiry Officer's Work Book will be used by Officers to fulfil their disclosure responsibilities under the Act, enabling the Disclosure Officer to do the same.
