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1. Policy statement

A National Standard for Incident Recording was introduced in the National Policing Plan 2004. It arose out of widespread recognition of the limited value of non-crime incident recording in the police service.

The principal aim of NSIR is: to ensure that incidents are risk assessed at the earliest opportunity leading to an appropriate response as well as being recorded in a consistent and accurate manner to help the police and local communities tackle anti-social behaviour (ASB) and other issues.

Cleveland Police will ensure all incidents are recorded in accordance with NSIR regulations.
