Anti Social Behaviour

Summerhill Country Park

Unknown persons are still causing issues at Summerhill Nature Reserve, off Catcote Road. Following the arrival of lighter nights and better weather youths started fires, damaged the children's play area and used air guns to kill some of the wild birds at the site. And now with Quad bike riders causing criminal damage, Hartlepool Borough Council has joined forces with Cleveland fire brigade and Cleveland Police to tackle the problems.
